

I want to take the opportunity space to express my enthusiasm for the BLB Institute's partnership new with LBC | Capital. But the word simply means "guidelines for interpretation." At BLB, we are passionate about getting people into God's Word. But we do not want them to merely read it—we want them to understand it!

A hermeneutics course gives us the tools necessary to arrive at the correct meaning of a given passage. Understanding a verse is much more than "what it means to me." It is grasping what God intended to communicate when He inspired every word of Scripture. This means avoiding the temptation to quickly jump to a conclusion that may or may not be accurate. It involves investigating the grammatical and historical context, words and sentence structure, nuances of the original language, etc. Such diligence is not only worthwhile, it is required of the workman who is presented as approved to God, "accurately handling the word of truth" (2 Tim 2:15). And of course, our BLB web site provides many of the tools that are discussed in the LBC | Capital hermeneutics course. I strongly encourage you to consider whether this and the seven other courses provided would accelerate your spiritual arowth.
